Policy Title: Student Transfers	Effective Date: September 14, 2005

Any student transferring to the district from non-state or non-Northwest Accreditation (grades 9-12) approved schools, public, private or parochial, shall be required to demonstrate proficiency in the several subjects required by the state or district for placement at the proper grade level.

Students being readmitted to a K-8 grade level from a home school or from a private school, shall be placed in the grade as determined by the building multi-disciplinary team. The MDT shall include the building administrator, support services personnel, teachers, and the child's parent or guardian.

Credits and records of transfer students, grades 9-12, from Northwest Accreditation accredited schools will be accepted upon receipt of official transcript.

Students (grades 9-12) transferring from non-Northwest Accreditation accredited public schools or nonpublic schools, including private, parochial and home study, will receive credit toward high school graduation for non-secular courses taken at the non-public school as follows:

- a. The student's official transcript, description of course content, and student work samples will be evaluated by a building team consisting of the principal, a school counselor and a teacher. The team may award credit when it has been determined that a course is equivalent in content, scope and rigor to established courses of study and the student has demonstrated an acceptable level of proficiency.
- b. A student may receive credit toward high school graduation by passing an examination which assesses the student's knowledge of a given subject. The examinations must be approved and administered by the school district, and must cover the content included in a regular secondary education course on the subject. Credit by exam opportunities must follow the procedures outlined in 6110p.
