<p><u>PROCEDURES FOR STUDENT DRESS:</u></p> <p>A. <u>The District Dress Policy</u> addresses neatness and modesty. It specifically mentions dress slacks and jeans as an example of appropriate attire. Some dress fads are disruptive because they are novel. Other fads are disruptive in nature. The faculty, staff, and administration will be responsible to maintain an educational atmosphere and learning process, free from distractions. Distractions will include student attire.</p> <p>B. <u>General Dress Guidelines</u> Clothes will be clean and in a good state of repair. Styles that indicate a slovenly appearance are not appropriate.</p> <p>Modesty is an expected guideline. Styles that include tank tops, bare midriffs or bare backs or low worn pants that show underwear or buttocks are not acceptable.</p> <p>Clothes that have offensive slogans or pictures written on them are unacceptable. This includes, but is not limited to, vulgar words, profane or obscene slogans, or dual meaning advertising, particularly those with sexual innuendos. Advertising of any drug, alcohol, or tobacco is inappropriate.</p> <p>Footwear must be worn.</p> <p>Gang related dress, behavior, gestures, symbols that could symbolize gang membership are not acceptable.</p> <p>C. The administrative procedure to be followed while enforcing the District Dress policy shall be:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Each faculty/staff member will report to the building principal or designees, any student whose attire is disruptive to the classroom environment, the school environment, and/or distractive to the other students. 2. The principal will invite the parent of any student inappropriately dressed to bring a change of clothing, or to take the student home for a change of clothing. 3. Any student whose attire is disruptive to the educational process or atmosphere may be removed from the classroom or school activity until the distraction has been remedied. 4. Students who repeatedly violate the dress policy may be recommended to the Superintendent and School Board for expulsion. <p><u>NOTE:</u> When a student comes to school in inappropriate attire, the parents/guardian of the student will be notified. In this notification, the principal or designee will identify the distractive (disruptive) nature of the attire.</p>
