
Rockford Elementary

A special thanks to all S.R.H.S. students and staff for making Charity Week such a great success and for making it possible to help several families in our community have a very Merry Christmas! The total amount of money raised during Charity Week was \$5,000. They raised over \$3,000 during the Charity Assembly alone. This holiday season they provided Christmas for eight (8) families and twelve (12) individuals in the Snake River School District by distributing food, coats, gloves, hats, shoes, toys, etc. The High School collected a total of 3,081 food items and 1,100 pounds of potatoes. They donated coats, canned food and potatoes to the Bingham Crisis Center; fourteen (14) boxes of food and 400 pounds of potatoes were given to the food bank; and food was also given to fifteen families. The school also donated \$500 to Brandyn Gee for a walker and \$250 to the Leukemia Society.
